All care must be taken exiting the course. GUIDELINES: COURSE CAPTAIN: To risk assess with wind conditions, closing all courses if deemed unsafe. To assess safety around fallen tree as to whether range can be opened and used, or work needs to be completed to remove risk. Report to committee regarding risk and work required. To close course during competition using horn blasts if deemed necessary. ARCHERS: Be mindful of conditions which may cause trees to fall. Adhere to course being open or closed by Course Captain or Committee if tree is down for further action.
