Indoor Championship.... What's it all about?

FCA will be running an indoor championship which will consist of 4 separate rounds held through the year. Utilizing the IFAA indoor rules.

Fee per round is **\$20.00** for a PAID UP FINANCIAL member, **\$25.00** for a NON MEMBER.

To compete you must shoot a minimum of 3 rounds, which will be held through the year. (If you choose to shoot 4 rounds, your lowest score card will be dropped from your final tally. It is worth doing all 4 rounds to increase your score average.)

Your shoot fee per round will include your score cards and your nominated target

You can hire a bow with 5 arrows for \$10 if you haven't got your own yet to compete.

The fourth Round will finish with match play for 1st places (if required) a sausage sizzle and prize giving including club Indoor Championship Trophies.

ENTRIES ARE LIMITED TO **40** shooting positions so get your entries in quick. (If there are more archers than positions available, we will may look to squeeze in few extra nights to make up 4 extra rounds.)

HOW THE GAME IS PLAYED ...

Each archer is responsible for following the shoot director's instructions and timing rules, and must adhere to these instructions at all times during the tournament.


At the sound of the first whistle, all archers must proceed to the shooting line, (you straddle the line for this competition) On the 2nd whistle you may begin your end. Each end consists of a 4 minute time slot, where you shoot 5 arrows at either a single spot target or a 5 spot target face. (Archer to nominate what they would prefer to shoot when they register for the event).

At the end of the 4 minutes a third whistle will sound which means the archers may lay down their bows and go and score their target. This system is repeated until 6 ends are achieved.

Scoring from the middle spot out each arrow as 5,4,3,2,1. All arrows must cut into the higher scoring zone to collect the higher score, not just touching the line.

The competition will consist of 2 standard units which is 2x 6 ends, 5 arrows per end shot at a distance of 20 yards, (18.3 meters) Cubs will shoot at a distance of 10 yards (9.15 meters).

60 arrows per round.



((Depending on numbers registered, you may be required to shoot in a detail, that means up to 4 archers per target butt, rotating through detail A/B then detail C/D. In a standard unit (6 ends shot) Archers A and B will shoot their own target which will be at the bottom of the target butt, then detail C and D will shoot their own targets which will be placed at the top of the target butt. After the first standard unit, there is a break, and your target faces will be reshuffled on the butt, for the 2nd standard unit, the details swap so D and C will shoot bottom and first then B and A shoot top and second, this not only changes you from bottom to top, but also left to right.))
